Filtering and Sorting Assets in Your Smash

If you have a lot of clips, video and image, assets within a project, it can be hard to find the exact asset you are looking for in the Smash Builder.

We added search, sorting and list view to help you find all of your assets quickly.

For clips specifically, we have also added filter by video and filter by tag options.

Let's navigate to the Clips tab.

We have included two filter options specifically for your clip assets, filter by video and filter by tags.

Let's choose the filter by video option.

You will see we now have a list of all of the video assets we have in Clipsmash.

Click on one of these video assets.

You will notice your clips have now filtered down to show only clips that have been made from that video asset.

Let's go back and choose the filter by tags option.

This will show you a list of all of the tags that you have created.

You can select one or more tags to filter by.

This will filter down your clips list to ones that only contain those specific tags.

This is not additive so if you choose a solo 1 tag and a solo 2 tag, it will show clips where you have added a solo 1 tag or a solo 2 tag.

To search for a specific clip asset, click into the search field.

[00:01:30]

You can search by name or tag if you search solo for example, any clip that is named Solo or has a tag that is Solo will show.

This same concept applies to the videos and images tabs as well, since these types of assets do not have tags, your search results will only be based on the name of the asset.

To sort your assets, click the most recent drop down.

This will give you a list of sort options.

This list changes depending on if you are sorting your clip, video or image assets.

Lastly, you can switch between a grid view and a list view for your assets.

The list view gets rid of the thumbnail and just lists out the name of all of your assets.

This could be helpful if you know the names of your clips or have set up a specific naming convention.
